### First Call for Abstracts, Short Courses & Sessions

You are cordially invited to submit an abstract for the 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the Pacific Northwest Chapter of the Society of Environmental Toxicology & Chemistry (PNW-SETAC) to be held **April 4-6, 2019** at the [Hilton Hotel](#) in Vancouver, WA (301 W. 6th St.). More information and instructions are available at <http://www.pnw-setac.org/meetings.html>. Online registration opens on **February 1<sup>st</sup>**.

Please consider submitting an abstract of your research you would like to present as a platform or poster presentation or, better yet, of a Short Course or Special Session you would like to chair on a topic of interest to you! Abstract submitters will be informed as to whether their abstracts have been accepted by **February 11<sup>th</sup>**. Platform presenters will also be provided the day and time of their presentation. Short courses and special sessions will be held on Thursday, April 4<sup>th</sup>.

Please follow the enclosed or online [Abstract Submission Guidelines](#) and indicate your preference for giving a platform or poster presentation, short course, or special session when submitting your abstract. **If you are a student**, please indicate your degree program and whether you want to be judged for Best Student Presentation Award.

**ORAL PRESENTATIONS**: PowerPoint presentations are limited to 15 minutes, with an additional 5 minutes for discussion or questions. Lettering should be large enough to be read at a distance of 100', e.g., 72 pt for titles, 42 pt for presenter affiliation, and 24 pt or greater for text.

**POSTER PRESENTATIONS**: should be able to fit on a 3' x 4' board using Velcro or tacks. Supplies will be provided onsite. Lettering on posters are the same size as for platform presentations.

**STUDENTS**: are especially encouraged to present their research project or thesis research at our less formal Chapter meetings to gain presentation experience. We offer **Best Student Presentation Awards** for both platform and poster presentations that involve a cash award, one-year free membership in PNW-SETAC and SETAC North America (including access to the *Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry* journal), and funds to attend the SETAC NA annual meeting in the fall.

Students should also apply for travel funds to attend the meeting using the [Application for Student Travel Funding](#). Applications **must** be submitted to **Ed Kolodziej** ([koloj@uw.edu](mailto:koloj@uw.edu)) no later than **Friday February 1<sup>st</sup>**. Students will be informed by **February 11<sup>th</sup>** regarding travel funds they have been awarded.

# PNW-SETAC ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

## PLEASE follow instructions carefully!

Abstracts, excluding author and title lines, should be **no more than 300 words**. **Longer abstracts will be returned to the author for editing.**

## The abstract should be in the format shown, below, following these instructions:

- Type the title of the abstract in bold and in Title case. Center the title on the page.
- List authors with the last name first, then the first and middle initials.
- In the case of 2 or more authors, place an asterisk \*after the name of the person presenting the paper/poster.
- In cases of authors from different institutions, use a superscripted number at the end of each author's name and the corresponding number in front of their institution.
- Include the name of the institution, the city and state, but not the department affiliation or street address.
- Use **Time New Roman** font, **size 11**, one-inch left and right margins, **single spaced**, fully **justified** to right and left margins, species names should be in italics.
- Do not indent any part of the body of the abstract text. **Use "returns" for spacing.** The text should be a single paragraph.

## The following information should be included after the abstract:

1. Presenting author and affiliation, Contact Author (we suggest that this be the presenting author)
2. Institution, complete mailing address, phone number, FAX number, and your E-mail address
3. Your preference for oral or poster presentation
4. **Students:** please indicate your degree program, e.g., M.S., B.S., PhD
5. Is this abstract for proposing a **Short Course?** \_\_\_\_\_ A **Special Session?** \_\_\_\_\_
